## Gwanda District

### Agriculture and Livelihoods

- **25,971** farmers trained in conservation agriculture and/or livestock management;
- **6,573** farmers trained in horticulture crop production;
- **4** sand abstraction systems rehabilitated;
- **7** irrigation schemes developed/rehabilitated;
- **166** farmers performed agricultural activities in developed/rehabilitated irrigation schemes;
- **2,321** farmers adopted improved small grain seeds;
- **37** agricultural input fairs facilitated;
- **4** agro-dealers and **12** input suppliers participated in input fairs;
- **7** constructed/rehabilitated dip tanks benefiting **7,000** livestock;
- **13** constructed/rehabilitated dams benefiting **16,000** livestock;
- **3,598** households benefited from asset vouchers;

### Resilience

- **154** village saving and lending (VS&L) groups formed and strengthened;
- **1,335** individuals participated in VS&L;
- **\$308,480 USD equivalent** value of savings generated;
- **7,849** farmers trained in grazing land management;
- **3,949** community members participated in cash for assets work;
- **152** hectares of grazing land rehabilitated under cash/food for assets;
- **13** ward disaster risk reduction committees strengthened;
- **12,271** community members trained on identifying risk and mitigation strategies;

### Health and Nutrition

- **6** health centers with rehabilitated water and sanitation facilities;
- **11,962** individuals trained on Healthy Harvest (promotion of a healthy nutritious plate);
- **10,638** individuals participated in cooking classes promoting nutritious, locally available foods;
- **23,715** pregnant women received monthly rations of nutritious supplementary feeding;
- **29,703** children under the age of two years received monthly rations of nutritious supplementary feeding;
- **18,494** community members participated in care group activities;
- **3,612** individuals trained in participatory health and hygiene promotion;
- **1,693** households constructed hygiene facilities (including latrines);
